From the Pile on Fr. Kirk's Desk...



Lent is now in full force...have you noticed?

Liturgically it is easy. The color purple is abundant and our crosses and the Christus Rex have been veiled.

We are beginning our corporate worship with the penitential order which brings our confession to the beginning of the service and to the forefront of our minds. We have packed away the Alleluia's during this time and the kneelers seem to be getting more use than normal.

Lent is now in full force...have you noticed?

If you are fortunate to have a job, odds are you haven't noticed much of Lent in the workplace. For the most part, the business world doesn't change at all and things seem to just keep going along as usual. In our personal lives we are called to a Lenten season of some pretty serious self evaluation which is to be followed by an honest response to what we've learned. What might the workplace be like if there were 40 days of intentional and honest soul searching built into the schedule and followed by apologies and forgiveness? Would it have any effect on the economy?

Lent is now in full force...have you noticed?

Our personal Lenten journeys should be noticeable; not to others, but to ourselves. We should be able to tell that it is Lent, and not just Lent but a Holy Lent. A Holy Lent is made up of "self-examination and repentance; by prayer, fasting, and self-denial; and by reading and meditating on God's Holy Word." (The Book of Common Prayer, page 265) The outcome of a

Holy Lent is that "those who, because of notorious sins, had been separated from the body of the faithful were reconciled by penitence and forgiveness, and restored to the fellowship of the Church." (The Book of Common Prayer, page 265)

What we have a tendency not to realize is that those who have been separated from the Church because of notorious sins are really ourselves; all of us. Our sins that have caused this separation may not be known to everyone, but they are known to us or will be revealed to us within these 40 days. The Church, that is the Body of Christ, has many parts. It is time to unite and heal each part of us in order for the Body to thrive and grow.

Bishop's Corner



I need to ask your help on a major project. This is what the business leadership folks call a BHAG - a Big Hairy Audacious Goal. Since it's my idea, that **BBHAG** makes it а Bishop's Big Hairv Audacious Goal. But it's way

too big for me to accomplish myself. So I am turning to you for help.

This came onto my radar screen through my work as a Commissioner on the Governor's Commission for Nevada Volunteers. We administer Ameri-Corps, VISTA, RSVP, etc. while promoting volunteer service in multiple forms through both faith-based and secular programs. There are two annual events for public awareness. Nevada has historically

rated 51st in the nation in hours of volunteer service. (Puerto Rico is included in the 51. They are ahead of us.) Last year we surged to number 50. The two events to promote volunteer service are the Governor's Points of Light Awards and the MLK Day – A Day On, Not A Day Off.

My BBHAG is for MLK Day. This year, I was working on a United Way NV Volunteers project around the corner from one of our largest churches. There were kids from high schools there as work groups. There were Starbucks baristas forming teams to serve their community. There were teams of bank tellers scraping and painting a community center. But there were no other Episcopalians.

It struck me that we do our work as groups in house or out in the world as individuals with the faith behind our actions all too invisible. Very few people ever see us as a recognizable group doing service in our communities. That was not true in the community where I previously served. Churches built Habitat Houses or participated as church groups in Rebuilding Together, rehabilitating the homes of low income seniors. It is social justice and evangelism together.

So here's my BBHAG: -- 300 EPISCOPALIANS WORKING ON SERVICE PROJECTS ON MLK DAY 2013 – WEARING OUR T-SHIRTS!!! The Diocese will supply the t shirts. If it's a cold day, you can wear them on the outside. "Let you light so shine that people may see your good works and glorify your Father who is in heaven."

I believe we can do this – but only if we can begin work early. In many communities, the projects already exist and I can get your parish lined up through NV volunteers. In a few places, we will have to create our own projects. But it takes planning and recruiting. If you are willing to help organize and recruit people to work on a service project (usually that means minor handy person tasks, scraping, painting, yard work – or cooking and serving a meal for the people doing the other work) would you let your deacon or priest know – or let me know dan@episopalnevada.org.

This is an opportunity to serve God's mission in two ways: justice and evangelism. I hope to hear from you.

With the arrival of a new year, we have a corrected number for our weekly and monthly expectations from pledge and plate offering. We should average \$3,891.03 per week to meet

what was offered in the annual budget. The following table shows the weekly receipts from pledge and plate offerings for this period:

For the 4 weeks reported here, we exceeded our goal by \$8,186.66. A part of this excess has been dedicated to meeting our 2013 needs. Baptism

Much has changed in the way we view baptism over the last 50 years. It used to be something we had "done" for our children when they were babies. When we held a baptism, it was often done privately with just the family present – not as a part of the Sunday service. Our thoughts and even our theology of baptism have changed, perhaps because we live more and more in a secular world. We now understand it as the focal point of our life long journey with God.

In baptism we are named as God's beloved child, and marked as Christ's own forever. We are claimed by a love that never lets us go. Baptism forms our identity – we learn who we are and whose we are as we journey both individually and corporately as members of a faith community. We celebrate baptism together as a congregation, recognizing God's grace and promising to support one another as we grow in the mystery of God's love.

Some people have said to me that they want to wait to introduce their child into a faith community – wait until their child is old enough to make their own choices. Just as it's easier to begin a journey with a map, it's much easier to make your own choices if you have roots, if you have a point from which to start the iournev. Although we hold baptisms throughout the church year, there are some days the church has particularly designated. Two of these, Easter and Pentecost, are coming soon. If you have been thinking about baptism for yourself or your child, and would like to talk about this, please contact one of the clergy at 358-4474 for more information.

Safeguarding God's Children


