Do you see yourself as gifted?



I'm not asking you what you think about your IQ, just if you see yourself as being gifted. There is only one honest answer to the question. Yes. Yes, you are gifted. God has

given you many gifts, each unique and each worth sharing.

When we choose not to share the gifts God has given us, it makes me wonder if we haven't begun to really appreciate those gifts.

St. Paul's is an extension of our own homes and each of us is called to take care of the buildings, grow our ministries, and nurture those who God sends to us. What are the gifts in which God has blessed you? How can you share those gifts around your church home?

If you have the time and the ability to learn, we can teach you to how to do things in areas within the church that need special attention.

When we choose to use our God given gifts of Time, Talent, and Treasure we not only make St. Paul's a stronger and healthier place, but we strengthen our relationship with God...the very reason we come to St. Paul's in the first place.

Your gifts are very much needed and I invite you to schedule a time to meet with me so we can explore different possibilities for the best use of your gifts. Jr. Warden's Report



Many at Saint Paul's are home owners, and as such are well aware of the time and effort required in keeping things up. Those nagging leaks, the burnt out bulbs, the weeds that never go away and just the amount of time it takes to keep things clean and organized. Many of us are also well aware of the costs involved when we have to call in a plumber, electrician or contractor to handle a job that's just plain over our heads. We usually give serious thought when such things occur, weighing our own abilities (or those of a trusted friend) to determine if it really needs to be contracted or if it is a "Do It Yourself" project. All of this is in maintaining a home in the 1200

to 2000 square foot range. Now think about what it might be like if that home were TEN times that size! This is what the facility at St. Paul's (your "other" home) is confronted with in keeping it up to snuff. The good news is we have a much larger pool of expertise in confronting the problems. The bad news is that a lot of the folks that have been taking on these projects, because of age or health reasons, are no longer able to physically handle the work. This doesn't mean the know-how is gone, it just means some younger and healthier people need to step up to the plate for their turn. Many of the current folks doing the work had no expertise in a lot of the projects they were getting involved in, but wanted to learn something new. This, in turn, has allowed them to take on projects in their own homes that they never would have considered before.

An example of up-coming projects:

St. Paul's recently bought new thermostats for the entire facility. In the classroom wing, they will not be efficient unless we can find a way to better transfer the heat throughout the classrooms. To overcome this problem we will need to build additional vents from room to room. The easy way would be to put vents in all the doors, but Fire Code doesn't allow this. We will instead vent through the walls and "bridge" over the hallway to increase the circulation. It isn't rocket science, but will be very labor intensive. To contract this will cost thousands. To do it ourselves will cost a few hundred at most.

Another example:

The columns along both sides of the church have all had boxes placed on both sides of the beams to prevent the pigeons from roosting. Unfortunately, the boxes make ideal wren/sparrow nesting places. This defeats the purpose of the boxes and creates an additional problem of baby chicks falling out of the nests.

To overcome this we have located a source where we can get a type of spike to deter the pigeons and an environmentally friendly sticky substance that will discourage the smaller birds from nesting. The cost is minimal, but again, it's a labor intensive job and a dirty one at that. It is something that needs attention right now. Please consider volunteering some time and talent at your "other" home this spring and summer. You won't regret it. Male or female are welcome. We are an equal opportunity "employer".

We have installed a baby changing station in the bathroom across from the kitchen.

The water to the drip/sprinkler system has been turned on. We only found a few problems which will be fixed shortly (maybe by the time you read this).

Don't forget the "weed & clean" work day on May 4th beginning at 8 AM and going until Noon. Bring work gloves, knee protection, rakes, sunscreen, a good hat and lots of enthusiasm. "Many hands make for short work". I don't know who said that, but it sure is true.

Monthly Receipt Summary

April 2013



For the 2013 year, we expect to receive \$210,688 from our pledge and plate income. As a gauge, we should average \$17,557 per month from those

sources. Though not a sophisticated method, this gives us a guide to how we are performing throughout the year in regard to our budgeted

income. To help account for 4 Sunday/5 Sunday months we use \$4,052 per week for the comparison.

The following table shows the weekly receipts from pledge and plate offerings for this period:

Confirmation, Reception, Reaffirmation and Adult Baptism

The Bishop's annual visit will be June 30th. If you are interested in officially becoming an Episcopalian, please contact Fr. Kirk 358-4474 in order to arrange instruction for Confirmation, Reception, or Adult Baptism. If you are already an official member of the Episcopal Church, it might be a good time in your life to reaffirm your commitment. These important acts of commitment are done when the bishop is here, so don't miss out on this special occasion.

Confirmation: Confirmation is the affirmation of one's baptismal vows. It is a sacramental rite in which baptized persons make a mature commitment to Christ and receive strength through the Holy Spirit through prayer and the laying on of hands by a bishop. Confirmation is not required to become full members of Christ's Body; baptism takes care of that. But for those who were baptized at an early age they are expected, when mature and ready, to make a public affirmation of their faith.

Reception: Persons presented for Reception are those who have been baptized with water in the name of the Trinity, have previously made an adult public affirmation of faith in any other Christian Tradition (either at their adult Baptism or on a separate occasion) and now

desire to live their faith within the fellowship of the Episcopal Church.

Reaffirmation: Reaffirmation is suitable in a variety of situations for persons who have previously been Confirmed or Received. Have you returned to church after a period of being gone? Have you recently experienced some transition in your spiritual or church life that has changed your perspective? Was your Confirmation so long ago that it is time to reaffirm it? Were you so young that you don't feel you were mature at your Confirmation? Reaffirmation is a repeatable rite of renewal.

Adult Baptism: Holy Baptism is the sacrament by which God adopts us as his children and makes us members of Christ's Body, the Church, and inheritors of the kingdom of God. The *outward and visible sign* in Baptism is water, in which the person is baptized in the Name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit. The *inward and spiritual grace* in Baptism is union with Christ in his death and resurrection, birth into God's family the Church, forgiveness of sins, and new life in the Holy Spirit.

St. Paul's Nursery

Children are always welcome in worship, and in our community we are blessed when children act their age; so sometimes babies cry and toddlers run around. Don't worry, it's okay!

If you find yourself needing a little break, or if your child would prefer to socialize with other kids rather than hear readings and the sermon, we offer a nursery during worship for newborns up through age 4... and a little older under special circumstances.

The nursery is staffed on Sunday mornings beginning at 8:45 a.m. by Lindsay, our experienced, trained, and awesome caregiver.
