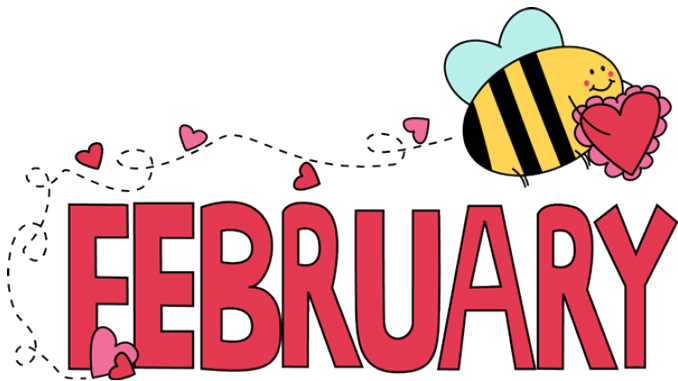

Rector's annual report in 2 minutes or less.

In 2015 we continued to grow into our mission statement which became evident in the recent parish survey. The results of the survey show that 97% of those who answered this question (90 of 93) believe that we are living into our mission to be a place of belonging for all people.

In Luke 4:21-30, God sent Elijah and Elisha to feed and heal people who were different and considered unclean (non-Hebrews). God did the same through Jesus and Jesus is sending us out to do the same task...letting all people know there is church where they belong.

To do this we need to better understand the historic shortfalls of Christianity. The particular shortfall we will look at during Lent is racism. This will be difficult, but join us on Wednesdays at 6:15 p.m. following the soup supper at 5:15.

We will also learn how to get out of our space and follow Jesus through our Sunday 3:00 p.m. book study: Crazy Christians written by our Presiding Bishop Michael Curry.

We, as a congregation, believe our mission statement...now let's go out and live it.

## Found Money Jar

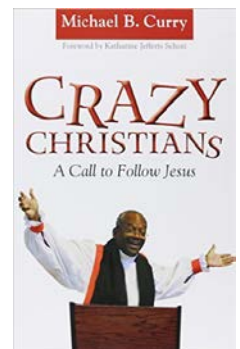

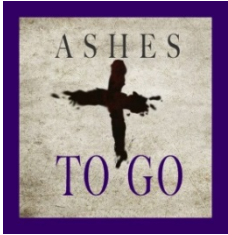

Racial Justice. (Trinity Institute)

Each week will be a different video presenter:

Week One: Spirituality and Racial Justice,

The Presiding Bishop Michael Curry.

Week Two: Whiteness and Racial Justice,

The Rev. Dr. Kelly Brown Douglas.

Week One, Bishop Michael Curry discusses  
ways in which Christians can work toward  
racial justice. He focuses on the spiritual  
elements of the problem: on the spiritual

failings that lead to racism and the ways in  
which spiritual tools are necessary to help us  
build a more just world. He discusses racism  
as one of the many results of the pride that  
separates people from God, and fighting  
racism as a first step toward reconciling all of  
humanity. He also goes into ways in which  
"wickedness in high places" can cause us to  
view appalling injustices as inevitable -- and  
some human beings as expendable.

Bishop Curry specifies moral and social  
reforms to help us work for racial equity -- and  
offers hope that racial oppression can be  
conquered.

**How long have you attended St. Paul's?**

**What about St. Paul's makes it a church home for you?**

It is in the active involvement with others that brings the church alive. The food outreach distribution and the two Lectio Divina groups for me have brought a closer relationship with certain people. I am searching for Christ in the world,

that is just part of me. I begin to see Him when I am with others, especially because of others.

### How have you experienced God's grace in your life?

God's grace shows in my life by the people I meet in Church and by the gift of searching. Grace doesn't mean (to me) that God gives me something like health or wealth. God has given me a searching heart. I am never completely satisfied when I learn something new. I need to see what is around the next corner. That has been God's generosity to me. There are many corners.

### What is one thing about St. Paul's you are most thankful for?

I am very thankful that the community of St Paul's understands that reaching out to others here in Sparks is so much of what the church is about. God is in our relationships with the ones we come in contact with. There is a spirit here at St. Paul's that starts from the vestry and Father Kirk's leadership that shines through. 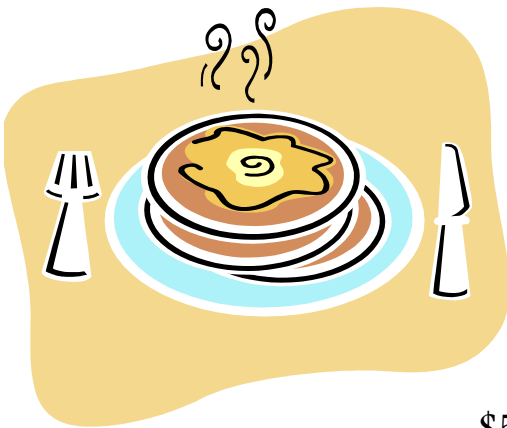

Where: California Building located at Idlewild Park in Reno.

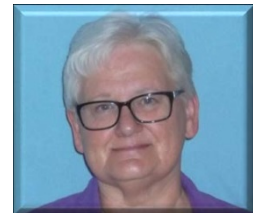
