From the Pile on Fr. Kirk's Desk...

I Apologize Up Front



I keep hearing it in some form or fashion, so I'll just name it for what it's been. 2016 has been pretty shitty. I apologize if my choice of words offends you; it is not my intent. Some words just don't work: lousy, nasty, crummy, bad, terrible, awful, dreadful,

rotten, crappy...these words just don't describe it. Horrible and horrifying might fit, but not quite. Shitty just fits. It's a word one would not expect to find in the rector's monthly newsletter. I think that's why it fits. It startles us a bit and throws us off balance.

Balance: "A condition in which different elements are equal or in the correct proportions." When we name something or speak the truth to a situation, we can begin to find balance, we can begin to find healing. We have had too many funerals in 2016, leaving painful holes within us. These losses of relationships have left us out of balance, but it is okay. We are supposed to be out of balance right now; love does that.

Staying off balance is not who we are. We are resurrection people. As hopeful people of the resurrection, we embrace the painful joy that comes with death and new life. We embrace our love for those we've lost as it weaves within our eternal relationship with our loving God.

Since we have now named 2016 for the darkness it has been, we can begin to experience the healing light around us. We can find it in our gratefulness of special memories. We experience it in the love, compassion, and support we both freely give and humbly receive and we are clothed by it

during our prayers, worship, and within the sacraments.

As we move forward, we must remember there is no timeline for us to regain our balance. We must also remember that since the healing light of Christ is both given and received, finding balance is done in relationships and not alone.

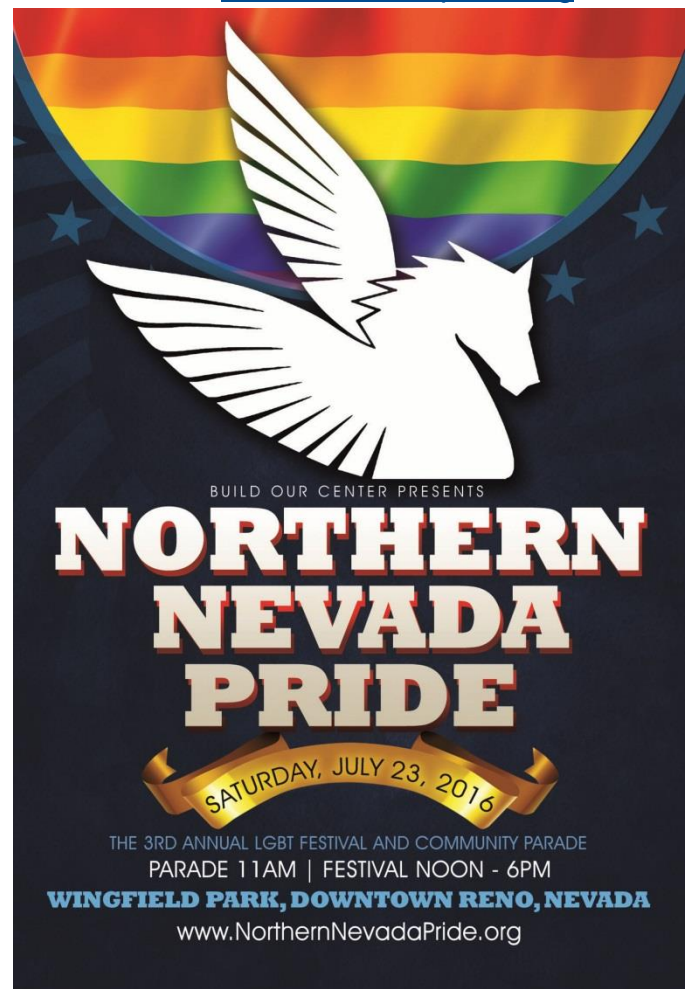

Outreach at Eddy House

On June 3, St. Paul's Outreach Committee provided a meal to the youth at the Eddy House YOUth Resource Center. On the menu were baked potatoes with chili, shredded cheese, sour cream, bacon, onions, and broccoli. Cookies and juice were also provided. The YOUth Resource Center, located at 423 East 6th Street, Reno, is a walk-in center for homeless, runaway, foster, and other at-risk youth to come for a hot meal, take a shower, do laundry, or just hang out in a safe environment. We received a tour of their facility and learned that "The YOU" sees between 30-50 youth a day. The average age of both boys and girls is between 15 and 19, although the program is open to ages 12 to 21. In addition to providing meals, the Outreach Committee is exploring other ways that St. Paul's can help.
