

From the Pile on Fr. Kirk's Desk...



I want to share with you a message from The Rev. Scott Gunn, who is the Executive Director Forward Movement aka, Forward Day by Day.

The message is a reminder for us to live into who we say we are at St. Paul's, and who God calls us to be.

Dear friends in Christ,

A couple of days ago I saw a Facebook friend post about her experience visiting a church. Lots of us do that during the summer as we travel. Anyway, her experience was not good. No one spoke with her. No one welcomed her. No one invited her to coffee hour. No one said they'd love to see her again next week. Now, she was just passing through, but her experience does raise an important question. Are we surprised our churches aren't growing?

My guess is that if I called the church office my friend visited and spoke with the staff or some members, they would assure me that their church is very friendly and welcoming. And they wouldn't be wrong. I'm sure the regular members there have a wonderful greeting each Sunday. But clearly, this church misses the mark with guests.

We need to do better. For one thing, welcoming guests is the basic stuff of healthy church development. There are lots of resources out there, from Forward Movement and others, to help with this. But that's not the best reason to welcome guests. In Matthew 25, we read Jesus' teaching about welcoming strangers. Now, I'm quite sure Jesus wasn't thinking of welcoming people to houses of worship when he said

that welcoming strangers is a core value for those who want to live righteous lives. But I am also quite sure that welcoming strangers is always important, in any setting. Jesus ranks it right up there with feeding the hungry and clothing the naked. Yes, it's that important.

This summer, as you travel, make note of your experience when you visit churches. Are you learning things that you can bring home? And how is your congregation welcoming strangers? Can you improve? Welcoming strangers and offering hospitality is great fun -- and the wonderful side effect is that our churches will begin to grow.

If you are up to it say, "I don't think we've met. My name is _____." Invite them back next week, and then remember their name and use it next time they show up.

If you are really feeling welcoming, invite them to sit with you during the service. Tell them that if they have questions, you might be able to answer them. Then take them to coffee hour, have them sign the guestbook and give them a welcome packet.

After they have gone, tell Fr. Kirk about them or send him an email.

Funding the Mission: July 2017

For the second quarter of 2017, our operating receipts totaled \$66,063 and our operating expenses totaled \$65,958. This gave us an operating surplus for the quarter of \$105. However, the budget predicted a deficit of \$5,813 for the quarter, so in total we came in \$5,708 better than anticipated! Our total expenses were close to what we budgeted, but our receipts were higher by about \$5,500. Almost half of this can be attributed to the financial health of the food pantry. They paid us \$2,500 in the 2nd quarter representing 6 months of rent on the space they use in the back of the church and they plan to continue

with similar rent payments. We thank them for that. The other half of the good news is attributable to strong offerings every month.

Looking at the entire first six months of 2017, our receipts have exceeded our expenses by \$6,134 and we have beaten our budget thus far by \$16,976.

I expect in the upcoming third quarter we may somewhat eat into this \$6,134 surplus. We are planning to launch a significant repair project along the eaves of the outside west wall of the building. It is also typical that offerings drop over the summer.

Interested in an in-depth bible study class? EfM (Education for Ministry) is a 4 year course sponsored by Sewanee- The University of the South. It is open to anyone interested in learning more about the Christian faith. Year One is a study of the Old Testament, Year Two is a study of the New Testament, Year Three covers the history of Christianity and Year Four focuses on Christian ethics.
