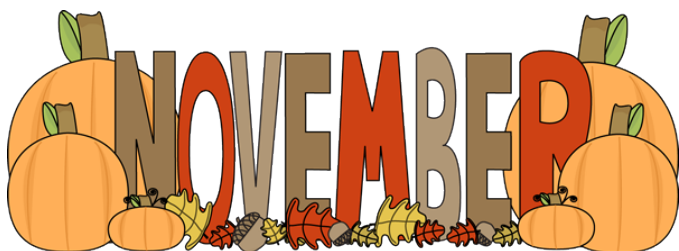

Why Attend Church at All?

Each week you hear me say how grateful I am that you are in worship and how important it is for us to share in fellowship, the Word and Sacraments, and be fed and nourished in such a way that allows us to go out into the world and do what we are called to do.

Though this is a great answer to my question as to why attend church at all, I want to give you a different perspective. Why attend church? It's all about knowledge and muscle memory.

Here's an example. What's it like when you get into your own car at night? You slide into the seat and without even having to look, you strap on your seatbelt and slide your key into the ignition. You flip on the headlights, shift the transmission into gear, and off you go. As you approach the first stop sign you instinctively apply the proper amount of brake to safely stop.

What's it like to drive a car that is not your own? Sliding into the seat feels awkward. You have to look to latch the seatbelt and look at the ignition in order to insert the key. You fumble for the headlights and struggle with the gear shift. As you approach the first stop sign, odds are you will under brake or over brake.

When we drive the same car every day we learn how to operate it without thinking. It is this repetition that gives our bodies and minds what is called muscle memory. It is muscle memory that allows us to quickly react to danger without having to think about how to safely operate the car.

Why should we attend church at all? This is

why. Experiencing Episcopal liturgy and the sacraments each week forms in us Christ-like values that become muscle memory. When we are confronted with evil and darkness in the world, we instinctively turn on the head lights without having to look for them and we can safely apply the brakes on our words and actions when needed. It is muscle memory that allows us to both see Christ in others and be Christ for the world...and the world needs more seeing Christ and being Christ, so I'll see you on Sunday.

You're Invited: It's Time to Party

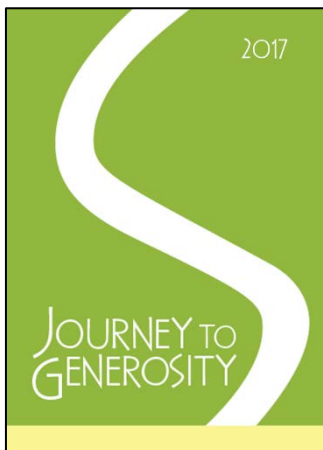

Funding the Mission



For the third quarter of 2017, our operating receipts totaled \$60,771 and our operating expenses totaled \$62,609. This gave us an operating deficit for the quarter of \$1,838. However, the budget predicted a deficit of \$5,207 for the quarter, so in total we performed \$3,369 better than expected. Our receipts were lower than budgeted which is often typical during the summer, but we also had lower than expected expenses which more than made up for it.

Looking at the entire first nine months of 2017, our receipts have exceeded our expenses by \$4,296 and we have beaten our budget thus far by \$20,049.

There are still some building repairs and improvements that we are trying to complete before winter. However, now that summer is over and the Christmas season will be approaching, I am optimistic that the fourth quarter will bring even better news.

The monthly Financial Statement of Mission contains detail regarding our financial activity and is posted in the narthex.

Congratulations to Deacon Mike

During the diocesan convention, Bishop Dan presented Deacon Mike with the 'For the Beauty of the Earth' award for his work on environmental stewardship. Deacon Mike and other Christian faith leaders traveled to Capitol Hill in February to urge their US Senators and Representatives to defend the Bureau of Land Management (BLM) Natural Gas Waste Reduction Rule.

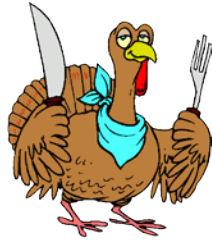
The BLM rule requires oil and gas operations on public and tribal lands to plug methane leaks. Each year, millions of dollars' worth of methane, the primary ingredient in natural gas, is wasted. The rule underwent significant stakeholder engagement processes, and religious communities participated with support statements and sign-on letters to decision-makers and trade associations. These letters noted that taxpayers lose out on more than \$330 million worth of methane each year as a result of wasteful leaking, venting, and flaring from oil and gas operations on federal and tribal land.

Thank you Deacon Mike for living out our Fifth Mark of Mission which is, "To strive to safeguard the integrity of creation and sustain and renew the life of the earth."
