Help Us Save Lives This Winter

This winter we have the opportunity to save the lives of some of our homeless neighbors.

The skyrocketing cost of living continues to push more people into homelessness. There is a critical lack of capacity at the city's overflow shelter and there is much concern that many people will be stuck out in the cold vulnerable

to frostbite, illness, and even death. Our community is facing a crisis and I believe people of faith and goodwill can step up to make a difference.

In partnership with the City of Reno, several faith communities and other organizations have come together to recruit teams of volunteers to staff an emergency overflow shelter for the winter months (December 1-March 31). Groups of at least 3 volunteers will be needed each night from 8pm till 6am the following morning. The shelter will be at a central location near downtown. This is simply intended to be a warm place for folks to sleep, so volunteers will not need to provide meals or other kinds of services.

Volunteer training: There will be a volunteer training on Tuesday December 5th from 6:30 to 8pm at The First Congregational Church (627 Sunnyside Drive, Reno, NV 89503). The training will include a brief tour of an overflow shelter.

If you are interested in joining this ministry, or you are just curious, please let Fr. Kirk know and try to attend this meeting if possible.
