

Resurrection Project

Easter is upon us. The tomb is empty and in that glorious gift there is new life. Alleluia! Alleluia!

Is three days enough time to collect dust? I think in some places the answer is probably no, but not here. Life in the high desert of Northern Nevada brings with it dust. Maybe you are like me, one who longs for the dust to be wiped away daily. Maybe you are also like me, one who has gotten used to the dust and thus stopped seeing it.

Maybe I began my journey into "dust blindness" because dust in itself isn't a bad thing. God picked up the dust, molded humanity from it, and breathed life into us. Upon our deaths our bodies return to the dust, and our life within it returns back to the source of our lives; we turn back into the breath of our loving God. So...dust can't be all that bad.

But Jesus didn't lay dead long enough to even collect dust, much less return back into it. Life came back into him, and like a good spring cleaning, emptied the tomb of something that would have otherwise collected dust (himself). The world would have led into their own case of "dust blindness", blindness to the new life. During the Easter season, I propose that we enter into our own spring cleaning which I am calling The Resurrection Project. During the great 50 days of Easter let's resurrect things that are collecting dust!

What do you have sitting around the house, in the garage, or in a storage unit that you don't need, something that is simply taking up space and collecting dust? Let's resurrect these items by finding them a new home. Let's get

this stuff out of the tomb, and give them new life.

There are a variety of ways to do this. You could have a garage sale. If you do, consider giving all the profits of the garage sale directly to someone in need. If you don't know anyone, you can always make a donation to the clergy discretionary fund and we'll pass it on directly to someone in need.

You could list your items as free on Craig's list or just put them on the curb with a free sign.

If you have clothing, take them to Good Shepherd Clothes Closet on Record Street. They donate clothes to those in need.

These are some ideas that allows people in need to get what they need without paying for them. Goodwill type places are okay, but if you do donate to them research to see who is actually benefiting the most by your donation.

There are others ways to get our dusty stuff, things we don't really need, into the lives of those who could really benefit having them.

Be creative and enjoy the Easter Season.

All twenty-eight of these children of God were living, breathing, outward, and visible signs of their baptisms.

When all of the sacred listening was complete, and the circle was broken, the people gathered were more connected as the Body of Christ than before the circle was formed.

They were courageous and it was holy.

Host Family Needed for German student!

The UNR Honors Program is looking for a family to host a German student sponsored by the Congress-Bundestag Youth Exchange Program. He or she will arrive mid-August 2018 and remain until late June 2019.

Host families receive a monthly stipend ranging from \$250-400 depending on cost of living. It is expected the student will have his/her own room, follow all house rules, and take part in required chores. The student must also purchase a used car – that's built into the student's budget – so except for the first couple weeks helping the student get to UNR, the Social Security Office, and DMV, the host family is not a taxi service. Host families can also request a specific gender of student, a nonsmoker, etc. - no family is automatically assigned someone.

The student will take classes at UNR and perform a community internship both semesters. The UNR Honors Program assists in both enrolling the student in classes and finding an appropriate internship. Typically students also use some weekends and holiday breaks to travel.

I've been coordinating the program since 1999 and it has been in existence nationwide for 34 years, so please let me know if you have any questions or want more information. Looking forward to hearing from you at (702) 218 8709, or at dvillanueva@nshe.nevada.edu!


