What is St. Paul's Response to Homelessness in Our Neighborhood?

In my sermon on Sunday, July 7<sup>th</sup>, I posed the question, "What is St. Paul's Response to the increased number of homeless in our neighborhood?" If you were not here that Sunday, take a moment to go to Sermon Podcasts on our website and scroll down and listen to July 7<sup>th</sup>. I don't know the answer to the question because it needs to be OUR communal response in relation to the Gospels and not just my own. Whatever our response might be, our baptisms certainly call us to ask the question.

In order to get a feel for our communal understanding as Christians, we will have two listening sessions. During these sessions everyone will get an opportunity to share their personal thoughts without discussion or debate. No matter where you are on the spectrum of the homeless issue, be it to ignore them, tell them to leave, or house and feed them, we need to hear your perspective on this topic in relation to your faith.

Once the listening sessions are complete, we will set a date to discuss what we heard at the sessions. Whatever ends up being our response, we will not solve the problem of homelessness in our neighborhood. However, what we will do is sort through some of the complexities in search of what our Christian response might look like and with a little help from the Spirit, we might get a nudge to outwardly be Christ to those in need.

## Building Improvement Program Update

To clarify what our goal is the building project will be referred to as the "Building Improvement Program" from now on.

*Correct major physical deficiencies in the St. Paul's facility which endanger the continuation of its mission while working to do so while not seriously impacting the financial health of this parish.*

The way things are going we are finding problems that must be dealt with before we can do the roof and the parking lot, so we don't want to keep the focus that narrow. The first example of this is the gas pipe that is sitting on the roof. We need to move it well before we consider fixing the roof because it is a project in and of itself. It must be moved during the summer when we do not need heat in the building. The current process of raising money, engineering, selecting a contractor, and receiving permission from the city takes many months.

Right now, the area that we need to put all our focus on is fund raising. The best estimate we

have now for our current building repair needs is \$300,000. A few people on a fund-raising committee cannot achieve that goal. **It will take all of you to help.**

**Here are your challenges:**

1. Whenever we have an event **COME** and **BRING** at least **ONE NON-CHURCH MEMBER.**
2. Volunteer to help. Contact me or Margaret Bouzek and ask how you can help. We need people to take tickets at events, serve food, make cookies, sell raffle tickets at events, surf the web for information, make phone calls, etc. etc. No matter your time and talents there is a way you can help.

## Funding the Mission

The financial results for the first six months of 2019 are as follows. Our operating receipts totaled \$132,288 and our operating expenses totaled \$133,061. This gave us an operating deficit for the period of \$773. The budget predicted a deficit of \$2,578 for the quarter, so we are tracking within \$2000 of our projections.

Although our deficit for the year is less than \$1000, it is primarily due to lower than expected expenses. Pledge receipts for the last two months have missed the budgeted projection by over \$5,000. Fortunately, due to a lack of any major repairs and a staff opening in the nursery, lower expenses have made up for our receipt shortfalls.

The budget's forecast for the last six months of the year predicts a \$16,226 deficit. Over these six months I don't see much opportunity to save significantly more on expenses, and likewise there is little reason to expect a sudden increase in receipts. Therefore, it seems likely that we will end the year, somewhat close to the budget's forecast of an \$18,803 operating shortfall for 2019. Covering this size of a deficit would use over 60% of the money we had at the beginning of the year in our "rainy day savings" fund.

The monthly Financial Statement of Mission contains detail on all our financial activity, and is posted in the narthex.


## Education for Ministry (EfM)

### What is EfM?


