Part one was really last month when I asked you to please pray about this...

"In your heart, do you believe in the importance of social distancing? Symptom free people are infecting others by continuing to enter people's homes and by giving people rides to the store. I encourage you to meditate on how social distancing is the most important way right now to love your neighbor.

Doing what is right to love your neighbor, friend, etc., has never been this hard."

**Now, here we are one month later.** Has anything changed in your understanding of social distancing? The need is still with us. It is still the best way we can love one another and share the healing love of Jesus.

## Funding the Mission

April 2020



Although the first quarter of 2020 ended with the world battling a pandemic, our financial results finished on a positive note. Operating receipts totaled \$90,365 and operating expenses totaled \$72,704. This gave us an operating surplus for the quarter of \$17,661 which beat the budget's predicted surplus of \$13,327 by \$4,334. It's typical in the first quarter for us to run a significant surplus because several parishioners give their entire yearly pledge at the beginning of the year. However, beating the 1<sup>st</sup> quarter's budgeted surplus by over \$4,000 is due to lower than expected expenses.

As we enter the 2<sup>nd</sup> quarter with a several online worship Sundays behind us, I do see some drop in receipts. It's hard to predict how significant this will be to our financial well-being. We do have opportunities to offset these shortfalls with lower expense. For example, our utility bills will be lower, and we won't have any expense in a few other areas (e.g. flowers, wine). I should be able to better assess and forecast our financial health in my 2<sup>nd</sup> quarter report published in July.

The monthly Financial Statement of Mission contains detail on all our financial activity but is not being posted in the narthex at this time. If you would like me to email you a copy, send me an email at the address below.

### **A Call to Mission**

This set of Bible studies has been developed by the Anglican Alliance in consultation with a small group of biblical scholars, theologians and church leaders as a resource to help Christians reflect on their faith and scriptures in this troubling time of COVID-19. The Bible studies seek to create space for us to bring our hopes and fears before God and build resilience and trust. They allow us to lament all that brings sorrow and suffering and to reflect on how we can support those most impacted by this crisis. Above all, the Bible studies seek to help us to find hope, in reflecting on God's presence and love, and how God shares our sorrow and suffering and brings assurance of new life. All across the Communion, churches are shutting their buildings as public health measures are implemented to prevent the spread of COVID-19. But even if the building is closed, the

Church is still there, present in the people, the living body of our Lord Jesus Christ. It is a time when God calls us into an ever-deeper participation in God's mission.
