Helpful Hints for Receiving Holy Communion

- You do not have to be a member of the Episcopal Church to receive Communion. You are invited.
- The usher will let you know when it is time for your row to go up for communion.
- Watch the people in front of you to get the flow of things.
- Only receive bread in your palm if you are skipping the wine.
- To receive the bread and if you want to Intinct ("dipping" the wafer into the cup of wine) the minister will place the wafer between your thumb & pointer fingers (pinch it) then you can Intinct (dip) the wafer into the chalice.
- Please do not drink from the cup. Intinction only.

Lector: We will now read a portion of Psalm 33

Lector: Happy is the nation whose God is the Lord! * happy the people he has chosen to be his own!

From where he sits enthroned he turns his gaze * on all who dwell on the earth.

THE SECOND LESSON Hebrews 11:1-3, 8-16

Lector: A reading from the Letter to the Hebrews.

Now faith is the assurance of things hoped for, the conviction of things not seen. Indeed, by faith our ancestors received approval. By faith we understand that the worlds were prepared by the word of God, so that what is seen was made from things that are not visible. By faith Abraham obeyed when he was called to set out for a place that he was to receive as an inheritance; and he set out, not knowing where he was going. By faith he stayed for a time in the land he had been promised, as in a foreign land, living in tents, as did Isaac and Jacob, who were heirs with him of the same promise. For he looked forward to the city that has foundations, whose architect and builder is God. By faith he received power of procreation, even though he was too old-- and Sarah herself was barren-- because he considered him faithful who had promised. Therefore from one person, and this one as good as dead, descendants were born, "as many as the stars of heaven and as the innumerable grains of sand by the seashore." All of these died in faith without having received the promises, but from a distance they saw and greeted them. They confessed that they were strangers and foreigners on the earth, for people who

speak in this way make it clear that they are seeking a homeland. If they had been thinking of the land that they had left behind, they would have had opportunity to return. But as it is, they desire a better country, that is, a heavenly one. Therefore God is not ashamed to be called their God; indeed, he has prepared a city for them.
