

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Summer Combined Worship Schedule Begins May 27th

On May 27th we will begin having only one Sunday morning service at 10:00 a.m. We will continue to have only one Sunday morning service through Labor Day weekend. We will continue to have the Sunday evening 5:00 p.m. service throughout the summer.

From the Pile on Fr. Kirk's Desk... Hospitality First



As you know, during Lent we received Holy Communion at standing stations at both the 9:00 a.m. and 11:00 a.m. worship services. During that time, I received positive feedback about this from

people who attend each of these service times.

Those who commented about the 11:00 service liked it because it made receiving Communion during Lent different than normal and they said is enhanced their Lenten experience.

At the 9:00 service, I had positive feed back from some who had previously received Communion in their seat because they could not get up the step at all. There were others at the 9:00 service who liked it because they had trouble getting up and down the altar step which caused them anxiety. Receiving Communion at standing stations took away that anxiety which has made their experience more meaningful.

The idea of long-time Episcopalians experiencing anxiety while receiving Holy Communion troubled me, though I might understand it from someone who was new to receiving those sacred gifts. Holy Communion is something that for me has always taken away my anxious feelings, not added to them; experiencing Holy Communion should open our hearts to accepting God's grace and forgiveness.

At the end of the Eucharistic prayer we hold up the real presence of Christ contained within the consecrated bread and wine and we say, "The Gifts of God for the People of God. You are all welcome at Christ's table." When we say, "You are all welcome at Christ's table" it lets the congregation know that everyone is equally invited to come and receive these precious gifts given to us by Christ. If we think about it, has it actually been an equal experience at our 9:00 service?

What does it say when we distribute Holy Communion in a place that is not accessible to everyone?

Over the last few weeks, I have surveyed the congregation the best I could asking for thoughts about how we receive Holv Communion. I talked with or received emails from approximately 80 people. Out of those 80 there were fewer than 5 people who wanted to continue to receive Holy Communion up around the altar. There were 8 who would prefer us to receive at the altar rail and about 25 preferred the two standing stations like we did during Lent. The rest voted for standing stations but didn't really have a preference other than saying the more inclusive the better.

Throughout this survey, what I heard over and over again was the importance of reverence, intimacy, and inclusivity. For some being around the altar was more intimate, while for others it was more intimate while at the standing stations or kneeling at the rail. For some receiving around the altar was more reverent, though for others reverence was more present while receiving at standing stations or kneeling. Reverence and intimacy are extremely important when receiving Holy Communion, but the overwhelming consensus from the congregation is that without inclusivity in the Eucharist, we are not being in communion and therefore Communion would not be Holv.

Jesus knew a lot about radical hospitality and so does St. Paul's. We will continue to receive Holy Communion at standing stations during the 9:00 a.m. service. During the 11:00 a.m. and the 5:00 p.m. services we will receive Holy

Communion at the altar rail, and I encourage those who prefer to stand at these services to come to the center where there is no rail. This will make it easier for you to receive the wine.

Thank you for your participation in giving me the feedback I needed to help in this decision.

Bishop's Corner



One of the questions I hear most often is "how are we doing?" — meaning is the Episcopal Church growing, shrinking, or holding its own. There seems to be a vague perception that we are sliding downhill. I heard even before I came to Nevada — and have

been hearing ever since -- that our membership numbers are stagnant and have been stagnant for a long time.

The best measure of vitality I know is "Average Sunday Attendance." "Membership" important but not a reliable number. Many members are actually long gone while many very active participants in the church are not members. "Communicants in good standing" is even more subjective. But how many people are actually there on Sunday tells us something. This year we do not yet have parochial reports from three of our parishes, so we have to take them out of the count. I can tell you that two of them (the larger two) are growing and the smaller one is stable. So what do the numbers say about how the Episcopal Church is faring in Nevada?

Average Sunday Attendance in 2010 was up by 8% over the previous year.

Average Sunday Attendance in 2011 was up by 22% over the previous year.

Possible interpretation: maybe we aren't quite dead yet. Maybe some of our parishes are doing a decent job of sharing the gospel in Nevada.

To interpret the numbers a little more, the dramatic increases are in congregations with Latino ministries. However, those are not the only congregations growing. Holy Trinity, Fallon; St. Paul's, Sparks; and Grace in the Desert, Las Vegas are three standout examples of growing congregations without ethnic ministry programs. They are not the only growing congregations, just the ones posting particularly encouraging attendance numbers. St. Martin's, Pahrump actually lost a little attendance this year due to an extraordinary run of health crises and deaths; but they are being featured in a documentary by the Congregational Vitality Office of the Episcopal Church as a model of a small church that is growing thanks to active community engagement and congregational development activities.

I have no strategy for church growth in Nevada. But it looks as if someone out there is up to something and God is blessing it.

This also has the potential of bringing in new members. In addition it affords St. Paul's a method of generating operational funds to replace rental income we have lost over the last few years.

Heather has been doing a terrific job at doing the bulk of organizational work required to make the last three events successful but it is now time for all of us to consider kicking in some time to help her in an organized fashion. The fund raising team will control and maximize the success of these events.


