Park Place is an assisted living home in Reno. For the past couple of years, lay members from St. Paul's and Trinity have been providing a weekly visit to the residents who are interested. There was a break over the summer, and now it's time to determine if we should restart this ministry.

Are you able to join a team that conducts this weekly outreach?

- Visitations have been on Mondays at 2pm.
- The visit is scripted and takes less than 1 hour. We meet with the ambulatory residents in the activity room, conduct a brief ecumenical service, and serve cookies and tea during a 5-10 minute fellowship. We then visit a few residents who are confined to bed.
- An "every Monday" commitment is not needed. Once or twice per month will make a difference.

# **Funding the Mission**



St. Paul's Episcopal Church, Sparks October 2023

The third quarter financial results for 2023 again beat the budget projections. Operating receipts totaled \$54,637 and operating

expenses totaled \$62,239. This gave us an operating deficit for the quarter of \$7,602 compared to the budget's deficit prediction of \$13,037.

However, because of the surplus from the 1st quarter due to pre-paid pledges, the results for the 1st 9 months of the year continue to be favorable. We have accumulated a surplus of \$14,575 compared to the budget's prediction of a \$2,573 deficit.

The budget predicts we will run a deficit in the 4th quarter of \$14,400. If that holds true, we would end the year just about even, but I am still hopeful that we will again beat the budget for the quarter and end the year with a surplus.

Have you ever watched a silent movie the way they were originally experienced? Come and experience Nosferatu and Dorothy Jean Papadakos within the beautiful architecture of Trinity Cathedral in downtown Reno, **November 3<sup>rd</sup>**, **7:00 p.m.** A reception at 5:30 p.m. with light hors d'oeuvres and wine is also available. Tickets for both can be purchased by searching St. Paul's Sparks on Eventbrite.com or from the St. Paul's office. Movie tickets can also be purchased at the door.

A little bit about Dorothy Jean: She is an American concert organist, composer, lyricist, playwright, and author. She is the former organist at the Cathedral of St. John the Divine in New York City (1990–2003), the first female organist to hold that post. She was also organist for the Paul Winter Consort at the Cathedral's Easter and Christmas services and performed with the ensemble on their Grammy Awardwinning album Silver Solstice, released in 2005. In 2005, Papadakos co-produced Pompeii the Musical, for which she wrote the book, music and lyrics. The production was well-received, breaking box office records when it premiered in Wilmington, North Carolina.

In 2017, her first novel, *The Kingdom of Winter*, was published. Using fantasy characters to address climate change concerns, the book is now used in a science and literature curriculum for middle-school students.


