

Bishop:

I am the resurrection and the life, says the Lord; Whoever has faith shall have life, even though he die. And everyone who has life, and has committed himself to me in faith, shall not die for ever.

As for me, I know that my Redeemer lives and that at the last he will stand upon the earth. After my awaking, he will raise me up; and in my body I shall see God. I myself shall see, and my eyes behold him who is my friend and not a stranger.

For none of us has life in himself, and no one becomes his own master when he dies. For if we have life, we are alive in the Lord; and if we die, we die in the Lord. So, then, whether we live, or die, we are the Lord's possession.

Happy from now on are those who die in the Lord! So it is, says the Spirit, for they rest from their labors.

The First Lesson *Isaiah 25:6-9*

Lector: A reading from the Book of Isaiah.
