It's Election Time

I just want to say a few words about the upcoming presidential election. It is no secret this election is creating an overabundance of stress and fear in people's lives. I know this

is 100% true because I'm hearing it straight from your mouths, and yes, I feel it too.

My prayer is that you vote. Everyone who can, go vote. I'm a priest in the Episcopal Church, so I am not going to tell you who to vote for, just that you need to do it. This is important. Each of us needs to be able to profess that we used our voices at the ballet box. Remember, we are God's hands and voice...God works through us.

My prayer for you is that you vote and my hope for you is that you breathe...deeply. My faith in God's love tells me that it will be okay, even if the outcome is not as you wish it will be. All this stress and fear is unhealthy, and we need to be healthy (physically, mentally, and spiritually healthy) in order to show up and share God's love each and every day, no matter who wins the election.

If you can't sleep, turn off the news. If you can't love your neighbor because of the political sign in their yard, turn off the news. If you are without hope, turn off the news and focus on the good things that surround you. God is with you.

I can't promise that who you want to win will win, but I hold fast in my belief that God is in this mess, especially when fear is clouding our vision from that truth. There is a time to be still and know God, and there is a time for action. Today, let's breathe, be still, and know God. Then on election day, kick into action mode and use that knowledge to guide your vote.

Funding the Mission October 2024



The third quarter financial results for 2024 exceeded the budget projections. Operating receipts totaled \$67,988 and operating expenses totaled \$75,264. This gave us an operating deficit for

the quarter of \$7,276 compared to the budget's deficit prediction of \$17,605. Donations were again primarily responsible for this good news.

The bottom-line results for the 1st nine months of the year are also very favorable. We have accumulated a surplus of \$30,791 compared to the budget's prediction of a \$2,608 surplus at this point. Again, we are well on track to run an annual surplus for 2024.

The monthly Financial Statement of Mission contains detail on all our financial activity and is posted in the narthex.

The Bishop's Cross

The Bishop's Cross is given by Bishop Elizabeth to a priest in the diocese who lives their life according to the vows each ordained person voluntarily takes. Those vows, found beginning on page 525 of the Book of Common Prayer, are very comprehensive. They include the way we live and move and have our being. They require upholding the doctrine, discipline, and worship of The Episcopal Church. Moreover, they commend a life of study, prayer, and service.

In Bishop Elizabeth's first year with us, the Bishop's Cross was awarded to the Rev. Marla Asson for her tireless work on behalf of those with limited voice and representation - particularly those who seek to serve God and the Church. Last year, the Bishop's Cross was award to the Rev. Trudy Erquiaga for her ongoing and successful call to lift lay leaders across multiple Mission Districts through her classes, conversations, and counsel.

This year the Bishop's Cross was awarded to the Very Rev. Kirk Woodliff, rector of St. Paul in Sparks. Fr. Kirk's work in the diocese crosses all the right boundaries. He supports marginalized and overlooked communities whenever he can, from offering safe places for children to read books to feeding hungry families. He spends time forming disciples and growing congregations as a dean of the Northwest Mission District. But most of all Fr. Kirk speaks the truth in love. He is neither harsh nor mean, but gives wise counsel. Even when that counsel may seem unpopular or difficult. He has a generous spirit and loving heart. 
The parish hall will be open at noon, and we will eat at 1:00p.m.

Chesterton, Bauerschmidt breathes life back into that claim, drawing from Scripture, great Christian and non-Christian writers of the past, and his own lived experience to show just how countercultural and subversive Christianity is actually meant to be. Eschewing the abstract and dogmatic in favor of the relational and inviting, he offers something for everyone, from lifelong churchgoers and students of religion to the growing population of "nones" among younger generations who are increasingly seeking spiritual fulfillment outside of institutional Christianity.

Tech Team

St. Paul's relies on technology to facilitate both live and online communication. Our Technical Team Ministry (Tech Team) is essential in making this happen.

The team utilizes the Zoom platform to ensure all parishioners can access church services. Our services are hybrid, available both in person and via Zoom.

We use cameras to broadcast and record services, sermons, and special events. Currently, we are learning and experimenting with new cameras and camera systems.

A soundboard is used to control the audio, directing it to the church speakers, hearing assistance devices, and Zoom broadcasts. We manage audio feeds from the praise team, choir, clergy, various mics, and auxiliary sound sources, balancing the sound as needed.

The Tech Team relies on each member's unique gifts to contribute to a quality service. Some volunteers have professional tech training and willingly share their skills, while others with an interest are being trained. Our team works collaboratively, so every member does not need to know every aspect of our technology. The goal is to have team members on a rotating schedule to run the cameras, Zoom, and assist with the soundboard. Members will also help install and maintain equipment and contribute to discussions about future improvements.

Currently, our team is very small, and we need more members to achieve our goals. Please consider if this is something you are interested in. It helps if you have technical aptitude and are comfortable with computers, but even if you are unsure, a willingness and patience to learn and contribute are valuable.

We ask that anyone interested in joining the Tech Team be committed to the church and our ministry, available to support technical aspects during services, and trainable in new and expanding technologies. This includes working with the soundboard, running camera systems, assisting with wireless microphones and hearing assistance devices, troubleshooting projectors, managing Zoom sessions, recording services, and helping produce a service that all parishioners can participate in, whether in church or at home. Once you join the Tech Team, we ask that you have grace, an open mind, a willingness to learn, and dedication to assisting with all technical matters before, during, and after services.
